

HORNETS NEST DISTRICT CUB SCOUT DAY CAMP - 2010

- When:** Monday - Friday, June 14th - 18th, 2010 9:00 am - 4:00 pm
- Where:** Bethel Presbyterian Church is located at 19920 Bethel Church Road in Cornelius, North Carolina, 28031, just off of Highway 77 near Jetton Park.
- Who:** All registered Hornets Nest District Cub Scouts. New Tiger cubs (rising 1st graders as of June 14th) may attend with adult partner participant.
- Cost:** \$100.00 if registered by April 16, 2010, \$120.00 if registered after April 16th, 2010 (\$20.00 discount if a parent or guardian volunteers for the entire week, M-F.) One Camp T-Shirt will be provided. Additional T-Shirts are available for \$8.00 each. Camperships are available for families with a financial need. (Please contact Alan Keiger at alan.keiger@scouting.org for more information.)
- Registration:** Each camper and staff member must submit a registration form. Registrations must be turned into your Pack Day Camp Coordinator. Payment must be made through your home unit. The council scout office will not accept registrations or payment for Day Camp. Each camper and staff member must also submit a health form with Parts A and C completed.
- Siblings:** "Pixies" (younger children of volunteers) and older siblings age 11-13 years should be registered separately, and must submit their own medical form. Registration fee for Pixies is \$5.00 per day or \$20 for the whole week. You must be volunteering any day your pixie is attending camp and if you leave, you must take your pixie with you.
- Volunteering:** We are always in need of volunteers. For every 4 cub scouts and siblings wanting to attend day camp, your pack must send a full week volunteer. It is a rewarding and fun experience for the whole family, so please come and join us.
- Boy Scouts:** Boy Scouts who are 14 years of age and are First Class rank are encouraged to volunteer as Camp Staff. Other Boy Scouts may volunteer if a parent is on camp staff or with the approval of their Scoutmaster and Camp Directors. Boy Scouts age 11-13 may volunteer to help, only if their parent or guardian is on staff.
- Transportation:** Packs are encouraged to organize carpools and utilize church vans or busses to and from camp. Bus service will not be provided by this camp.
- What to Bring:** **A bag lunch with the scout's name, pack number and day camp den number written on the bag.** All lunches will be collected and refrigerated each morning. Drinks will be provided. **Scouts should bring a canteen, water bottle or cup with a shoulder strap or belt hook.** Parents should apply sun screen before arrival at camp. **DO NOT BRING** lunch boxes, coolers, thermos bottles, games, electronic devices, game cards or other objects that may become a nuisance at camp.
- What to Wear:** Everyone, including staff, will be required to wear the official camp t-shirt. (For security) Only closed-toed shoes are permitted. **NO SANDALS OR FLIP-FLOPS** will be allowed at camp. Hats are recommended. Name tags will be provided and collected at the end of each day.
